While she may be known as a dance artist, coming into fame through her meteoric rise on the charts with the hit, "[TiK ToK](#)," with this sophomore effort, this pop queen proves she is a rocker and a bit of a punk who can successfully merge the genres of rebel music and dance floor beats.

After taking some time off for personal travel and to write and record, Ke\$ha has matured as a person and songwriter enlightened with perspective without losing her signature knack for making clever, chatty party rap and infectious

hooks. Combining stomping beats, a wall of techno, guitar riffs and Ke\$ha's powerful vocals, "Warrior" is clearly a tighter effort with songs that are sure to make her "animal" fans want to dance, party and own the room. She even pulled in fellow wild child, Iggy Pop, for a duet, establishing some punk rock cred.

On the commentary version of "Warrior," (available on the streaming service [Spotify](#)) Ke\$ha gives some backstory on the songs:

On "Warrior" - "We've all been through sh*t, but instead of letting it take you over and beat you down, stand up and face it and fight it."

On "Die Young" - "It's about how you should live every day and every night like it's your last because you never know how life goes."

On "Wonderland" - "It's a song about the flophouse I used to live in in LA."

On "Love Into The Light" - "It's a note to myself and dealing with haters and how we should stop judging each other and start loving each other."

On "Dirty Love" - "I got to do this song with Iggy Pop and I love it because we are just screaming about sex!"

The simultaneously released book provides a personal view of Ke\$ha through her own eyes. Presented in scrapbook/journal style, she shares her humble beginnings, the craziness on tour and how she wanted to let her love for glam and theatrical rock heroes such as [T. Rex](#) and [Alice Cooper](#) shine through on this new album without losing her dance rep that makes her a radio fave.

At age 25, she hardly seems old enough to pen an autobiography but then again, Ke\$ha packs more life into one day than most people. This double release shows that she not only plays hard, but she works hard too - even while she's pouring on the body paint and glitter!
